## **REPORTS**

2020 Budget Amendment – Director of Protective Services R. Krause

- Discussion of revenue earned due to the increased number of calls in 2020.
- This amendment is to account for the money received from EMBC
- Staff will buy a new piece of equipment and cover off payments to volunteers with the additional funds.
- The camera will be replaced as it is starting to fail.
- The new camera will go on the structural engine, and the old one will remain as an asset on the wildland engine.

THAT Council approves the transfer of \$11,500 from revenue to the Protective Services operating budget.

Road Rescue Grant Application – *Director of Protective Services, R. Krause, verbal* 

- The province allocated 1 million dollars for out-of-boundary road rescue organizations.
- Burns Lake is eligible for up to \$20,000 under this grant. The proposal will include new equipment for the rescue truck. A battery-operated hydraulic tool will be purchased with funds received.
- Also requesting additional scene lighting equipment.
- No Council resolution is required for this grant.

Investing in Canada – COVID-19 Resilience Infrastructure – *Director of Public Works, D. Ross* 

- Staff is giving council options for projects to apply for this grant.
- Which project is more likely to be successful?
- Either the shop or the arena would be the best projects.
- Active Transportation Grant next round is coming up soon; 70% of costs will be covered. This grant covers 100% of the eligible costs.
- Discussion of the potential of collaborating with Lake Babine Nation for another sidewalk project was discussed.
- In 2020, the heating and hydro costs were \$95,000 for the arena, and the savings will increase when the remaining areas of the building are included. 10% of \$95,000+
- Discussion of the value of cost-saving at the Multiplex.
- Discussion of the buildings at the public works yard. The goal will be to upgrade the older buildings to the same tin colour as the new structures.

THAT the Arena HVAC system repairs and upgrades project be submitted to the *Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program – COVID-19 Resilience* funding stream (CVRIS);

AND THAT the Village of Burns Lake commits to covering all project cost overruns.

- Perhaps the RDBN will share in additional funding.
