



## **2022 MUNICIPAL ELECTION Notice of Election by Voting**

**Public Notice is hereby** given to the electors of the Village of Burns Lake that an election by voting is necessary to elect a mayor for a four-year term and four councillors for a four-year term commencing November 2022.

#### **MAIL BALLOT VOTING**

All eligible electors have the option to vote by mail ballot. If you wish to vote by mail, your application must be received at the Village of Burns Lake office by October 3, 2022. Mail ballot applications may be requested from the Village of Burns Lake office or by downloading the application from the website, [www.burnslake.ca](http://www.burnslake.ca) (click the Municipal Election button at the top of the homepage). To be counted, the Chief Election Officer must receive your mail ballot by 8:00 pm on October 15, 2022.

## RESIDENT ELECTORS

---

There is no need to pre-register to vote. At the time of voting, you will be required to make a declaration that you meet the following:

- 18 years of age or older on general voting day, October 15, 2022;
- a Canadian citizen;
- a resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration (at time of voting);
- a resident of the Village of Burns Lake on the day of registration (at the time of voting); and
- not disqualified by this Act or any other enactment from voting in the election or be otherwise disqualified by law.

---

## NON-RESIDENT ELECTORS

---

At the time of voting, you will be required to make a declaration that you meet the following:

- 18 years of age or older on general voting day, October 15, 2022;
- a Canadian citizen;
- a resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration (at time of voting);
- a registered owner of real property in the Village of Burns Lake for at least 30 days immediately before the day of registration (at the time of voting);
- not entitled to register as a resident elector; and
- not disqualified by this Act or any other enactment from voting in the election or be otherwise disqualified by law.

In addition, for non-resident property electors:

- The only persons who are registered owners of the property, either as joint tenants or tenants in common, are individuals who are not holding the property in trust for a corporation or another trust.
- If more than one person is a registered owner of the property, only one of those individuals may, with the written consent of the majority of the owners, register as a non-resident property elector.

## DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO REGISTER TO VOTE AS AN ELECTOR AT THE TIME OF VOTING

---

- **To register, resident electors** must produce **identification** (at least one with a signature). Picture identification is not necessary. The identification must prove both residency and identity.
- **To register, non-resident property electors** must produce **2 pieces of identification** (at least one with a signature) to prove identity, **proof** that they are entitled to register in relation to the property, and, if there is more than one owner of the property, **written consent** from the other property owners.
